

Feed the Soil to Grow the Plants

Yes, it's an extended metaphor. But even so, Minnesota has the richest soil in the world. If the pH balance fits, run with it. Students cultivate that soil at Big Hill Farm, a student-run agricultural and environmental project that harvests 1,500 pounds of food each year that is also served in the cafeteria.

An organic campus is a stress-relieving campus. Long walks, short runs, bike rides, and staring at clouds all help keep you balanced, healthy, and happy.

BLUE EARTH

Gustavus lies on the ancestral land of the Dakota people, and the College works to raise awareness about indigenous history and culture through the President's Council on Indigenous Relations. The word Minnesota itself derives from the Dakota phrase, *Mni Sota Makoce*, which translates to "land where the waters reflect the clouds." Gustavus devotes itself to continuing respectful stewardship and historic awareness on that land.

Mentorship comes in many forms, and it's sometimes from other students. "Kendra Held '22 got me involved in the Environmental Action Coalition, a justice organization," Katie says. "It was the first time I plugged into that avenue of involvement. Now I'm the co-president.

"What I've learned at Gustavus is the idea of having balance and making yourself a well-rounded person goes beyond the kinds of classes you take. I learned my scientific and intellectual reasoning advances when I engage with people who aren't scientific in nature. It makes me ready to enter the adult world as a person who can face any challenge."




BROWSE THE GALLERY

"Gustavus was really, truly a blessing for me," Brenda de Rosas says. "Obviously, coming from a low-income background, paying for private college was going to be a difficult thing to do. I am debt free graduating from Gustavus. I feel so lucky to say that now. Work-study and scholarships and all the different jobs on campus allowed me to have a cushion, while also not having to leave campus."

Brenda had dreams of working in government, of finding new ways for the minority community to be involved in politics. With this in mind, The Center for Career Development helped her secure an internship with the Governor's Office after graduation. With The Center's assistance Brenda applied for a grant to cover the extra expenses. "The Center was so helpful in figuring out how to make that internship work. I wondered how I would be able to pay for gas and parking and have enough money to eat. There are resources."

Brenda now works as a legislative assistant at the state capitol. "Working in government covers every single aspect of people's lives, from taxes to the environment. Nothing is off the table. At Gustavus, I took biology, chemistry, and statistics, which have given me a better understanding of what individuals are advocating for. A liberal arts education puts the world in perspective."

PADDLEFISH BREWERY

Eric and Luke met in the Gustavus Choir and became fast friends, touring the world and singing in harmony. By the summer before their senior year, they'd decided to become business partners. They've opened Paddlefish Brewery right in Saint Peter.

"My Environmental Studies degree has come in handy quite a lot with my ability to brew beer," Luke says. "Research in Chemistry and the Environmental Studies Department taught me about how water acts in a system and how chemicals act in water. There's even an environmental concern with our name," he points out. "The paddlefish species used to be native to this region. We built dams and plugged up the rivers and only recently has that changed. Twenty years ago no one would have named a place 'paddlefish.' Now we're seeing a 90% increase in numbers right here in Saint Peter."

"I handle the business side of things," Eric says, "crunching numbers, working with spreadsheets. But my degree was in philosophy. Gustavus helped me develop the soft skills you need to apply yourself and adapt, and to learn quickly.

"The integration of values and information is important to us. What's driving us is creating a community and an excellent product, and doing so in a way that's about more than a bottom line."
