At YSU, athletics are part of campus life whether you're cheering from the stands, playing on a team, or trying something new with friends after class.

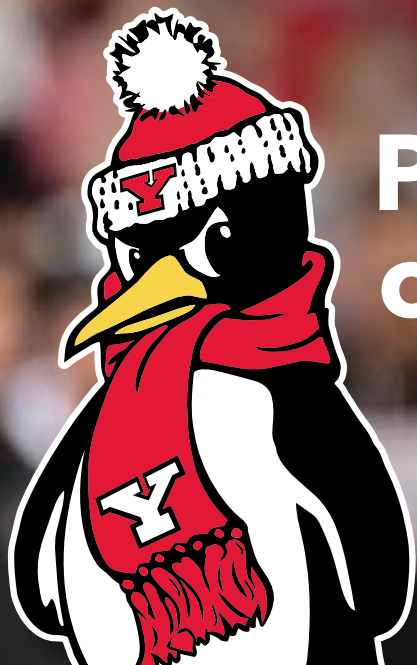
Maybe that means packing the stands for the Penguins.

Maybe it means joining an intramural volleyball team, playing pickup basketball, climbing at the Rec, signing up for a tournament, or finding your routine in a group fitness class.

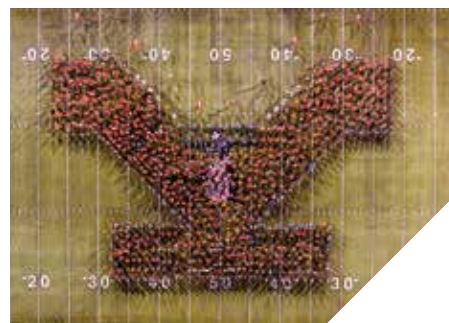

* Students meeting honors minimum criteria will be considered for up to the full amount – \$3,000 tuition and \$3,000 housing.

Students not meeting minimum criteria may still be eligible for a partial honors scholarship.

Test-optional merit-based scholarships will be awarded to incoming freshman students admitted under YSU's test-optional admission policy.

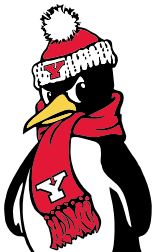

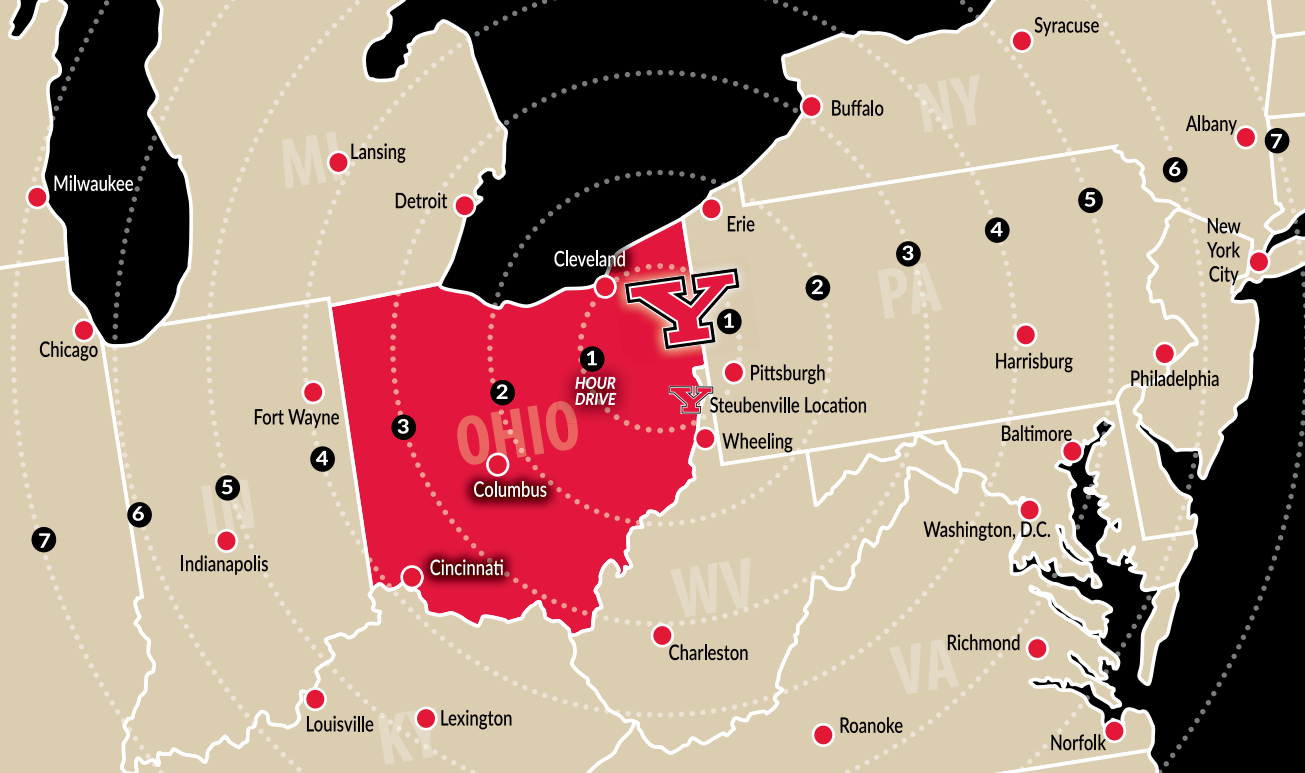
